

Naming Eeremony Introduction

The Introduction may involve an explanation of the purpose of the ceremony, the responsibilities involved, the benefits for the child in the interest of the adults taking part in the ceremony. Apart from the following pieces, the ceremony can also begin with a reading which expresses the theme of the ceremony.

No. 4

Ladies and Gentlemen,

(Parents of the Baby) have invited us today to take part in a ceremony which welcomes their baby into their family unit, and into the wider family of their relatives and friends.

And while the birth of their baby has meant great joy for them, this joy is not unmixed. The responsibility of this child's life and happiness is in their hands. From now on much of their life will involve caring for their baby, guiding her development, nurturing her growth as a responsible human being.

Just as they have invited you here to share their happiness and their joy, so (Parents of the Baby) also ask you to share their responsibility, realizing that the more love this child receives the more she will be able to give love to others. The more people make up her world, the richer her world will be.

No. 2

Ladies and Gentlemen,

We have gathered to share with (Parents of the Baby) their happiness and joy in their role as parents. While children bring with them great happiness they also bring with them great responsibility.

We rejoice with (Parents of the Baby) in the safe delivery of their baby, and know there is much happiness for them in the future through the many stages of growth that they will experience. The first smile, the first word, the first step, are all stages marking the development of the child.

(Parents of the Baby) recognize that a baby is the message of hope for the community, and the home the training ground of good men and women. In it are bred either those who will be leaders of new generations, or those who live only for themselves.

So we all join together in this service to demonstrate our willingness to share in the task of training this new life, guarding him from evil, and teaching him what a wonderful thing life can be.

No. 3

Ladies and Gentlemen,

Today (Parents of the Baby) have invited us to take part in this ceremony to express their commitment to their baby, while recognizing the challenges ahead of them.

But while a child is a demanding responsibility that often tests our patience and our understanding, it is also much more than that. A child brings joy, wonder and richness to our lives.

What pleasure there is in the feel of a newborn baby nestling in our arms, the smile of a toddler responding to our love, the small outstretched arms reaching for a hug, and a tiny upturned face planting a wet kiss on our cheeks.

Time will bring toys on floors and balls on lawns, a happy, healthy child playing in the yard. There will be bruises to kiss, report cards to praise, and drawings to display on refrigerator doors.

A child brings pleasure and wonder into the lives of those who bring it into this world. But it also means great responsibility; for what the child becomes is largely what you, as parents, bring into her life.

No. 4

Ladies and Gentlemen.

As we gather here today to welcome this child into our community we may pause to think what gift we can give him that will remain with him for the rest of his life.

There are many things that we value and that we think are important. But the most precious thing that we can give this child is beyond value, that nothing can replace - and that is, our time.

There are times when we get so deeply involved in our own chores and pursuits that we hate to stop what we're doing and give the child the attention he needs.

If we are to be truly committed to the development of this child, we must be prepared to lay down the book that we're reading to accept his invitation to come out to see a rainbow, or a cloud that looks like a dinosaur. We must be prepared to shut off the television set, the lawn mower, the vacuum cleaner.

Tidy homes, green lawns - is not what the child will remember. Rather, it will be the games you played, the confidences you shared, the times you spent together these will be remembered and treasured for years to come.

We honour the individual life of the child as we celebrate the miracle of the advent and the growth of the child. We see the wonder and mystery of life incarnate when we look on the face of the child

No.F

Every child brings new life and hope into the world. We set aside a special time today for the community, represented by those present, to bless the child and celebrate the blessing of this gift of life. The ceremony does not make the life of the child sacred; life is sacred in itself.

We understand that we are all part of the interconnected web of all existence. The community is part of the fabric that holds all human life, the story of many shared lives woven into our cultures, and the saga of each individual. We are who we are, in part, because of the love and guidance and the inspiration and ideals that we receive, especially from those who parent us.

No. 4

If there be righteousness in the heart, There will be beauty in the character. If there is beauty in the character There will be harmony in the home. If there is harmony in the home There will be order in the nation. If there is order in each nation There will be peace in the world.

No. 2

As a community of friends and family, we all share a responsibility to provide the atmosphere in which a child develops as a person, so it is important that we remember that

A child who lives with criticism, learns to condemn. A child who lives with hostility, learns to fight. A child who lives with ridicule, learns to be shy. A child who lives with shame, learn to feel guilty.

But a child who lives with tolerance, learns to be patient. A child who lives with encouragement, learns confidence. A child who lives with fairness, learns justice. A child who lives with security, learns to have faith. A child who lives with approval, learns to like himself. When a child lives with acceptance and friendship, he learns to find love in the world.

We adults would be shocked by such an insolent remark, for we have forgotten, if indeed we ever knew, that a child is an active participating and contributing member of society from the time he is born.

Childhood isn't a time when he is molded into a human who will then live life; he is a human who is living life.

No child will miss the zest and joy of living unless these are denied him by adults who have convinced themselves that childhood is a period of preparation.

How much heartache we would save ourselves if we would recognise the child as a partner with adults in the process of loving, rather than always viewing him as an apprentice.

How much we would teach each other...adults with the experience and children with the freshness.

How full both our lives could be.

A little child may not lead us, but at least we ought to discuss the trip with him; for, after all, life is his and her journey too.

By presenting the child to this gathering, the parents acknowledge that the child is more than a private possession, but is a new being in whom we all have a responsibility and whom we all welcome into this community.

Eenclasion

The conclusion summarizes the theme of the ceremony. It can be just a few words by the Celebrant, or a poem or song dedicated by relatives or friends. After the formal conclusion a certificate, detailing the child's name and date of birth is then handed to the parents. Where practicable, the baby receives a Certificate explaining his or her name, and the characteristics of that name.

To mark the occasion some parents like to surround the event with symbolism. One of these is the planting of a tree. This can take place during the ceremony or immediately after the ceremony.

Parents will have already prepared a hole. When the symbolism is to be enacted the parents, or the godparents place the tree in the ground. They and the parents will be the first to place some soil in the hole. All other guests, including children, can be asked to participate. Planted also can be the guests good wishes for the baby's future.

Having planted the tree the godparents, or the parents, will water it with a watering can placed close by for this purpose.

A common practice is also for a toast to be proposed immediately the ceremony is concluded. The drink will be poured out immediately the ceremony is finished and distributed among the guests, beginning with the parents and the godparents.

If the ceremony is being marked by the receiving of the gifts, the unwrapping of the gifts could be left right to the end. The gifts of the godparents will be unwrapped first, and if they happen to be jewellery, could be placed on the baby at the same time. Where the gift has specific significance the giver might like to explain it as he or she hands it to the baby.

Some parents also like to offer a gift to the people directly involved with the ceremony, so that as the Celebrant hands the Certificate to the person concerned, the parents hand him or her a gift to mark their thanks for their involvement.
