I ask the people here present to witness that I Bill take you Lyn to be my lawful wedded Wife.

Adrian to Lyn

[Repeat after me]

I ask the people here present to witness that I Lyn take you Bill to be my lawful wedded Husband.

Lyn and Bill have prepared some vows that they wish to share with each other. I now invite Bill to share his vows with Lyn.

Bill to Lyn

I now invite Lyn to share her vows with Bill.

Lyn to Bill

Rings

You are symbolising your marriage by the exchange of rings, may I please have the rings?

Ring Blessing

The wedding ring is a symbol of the promises of love and devotion you have made to each other today. In years to come, it will remind you of this day, when you became one in hope, one in believing in life, and one in sharing the years ahead of you.

Bill, please place Lyn's ring on her finger

Lyn, please place Bill's ring on his finger

Handfasting Ceremony

The couple will be celebrating today with an ancient handfasting ritual. I ask that Lyn and Bill please join their hands, left hand to left hand, and right hand to right hand, forming the symbol for infinity. I now ask Lyn's mum Carol and Bill's mum Lisa to come forward and bind their hands together.

Tying these cords means that the couple is no longer two separate entities but joined as one, bound together in mutual love.

These are the hands of your best friend, young and strong and full of love for you, that are holding yours on your wedding day, as you promise to love each other today, tomorrow, and forever. These are the hands that will work alongside yours, as together you build your future.

These are the hands that will passionately love you and cherish you through the years, and with the slightest touch, will comfort you like no other. These are the hands that will hold you when fear or grief fills your mind.

These are the hands that will countless times wipe the tears from your eyes; tears of sorrow, and as in today, tears of joy. These are the hands that will tenderly hold your children, the hands that will help you to hold your family as one.
